## COMMUNITY GARDEN GUIDELINES

All garden members should liaise with their garden committee to access the garden, many restrictions are in place and all members may not be able to access the garden at present

Enjoy and respect the garden while we ensure we all stay safe and protected and ensure we maintain our beautiful and well loved garden

- ► It is important to be aware of Public Health restrictions and guidance
- Social distancing, hygiene measures and coughing and sneezing etiquette must always be observed.
- ➤ Volunteers should work at least 2 metres apart the number of volunteers will be dictated by the size of the garden, bearing in mind the Government guidelines allowing "up to 4 people not of the same household to meet outdoors while maintaining strict social distancing"
- Wash or sanitise hands before and after unlocking the gates to garden where relevant.

- Wash your hands regularly in the garden.
- Use your personal hand sanitiser if there are no hand washing facilities in the garden.
- ▶ Do not wash your hands in the water trough.
- ▶ Ideally people should bring their own garden tools. Otherwise, when finished using tools sanitise the tool handles.
- Avoid going to the garden if you are particularly vulnerable, if you have coronavirus symptoms or a family member is self-isolating.
